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<u>A Story Through Impressions</u>



Essential Question: What can objects from the past tell us? **Objective:** Students will learn that they can tell a story by making impressions in clay. **Standards:**

- VA:Re7.1.1 Select and describe works of art that illustrate daily life experiences of one's self and others.
- VA:Cr2.1.1 Explore uses of materials and tools to create works of art or design.

Linked Assessment Outcomes:

- Students will select a collection of objects that will tell a story when pressed into clay all together
- Students will organize their objects spatially to imprint the story
- Students will reproduce a story by making impressions in clay
- Students will recall a story that they want to tell through impressions
- Students will analyze the objects before them and decide which objects would leave a clear impression in their clay
- Students will plan how to impress the objects into their clay
- Students will analyze their peers' clay impressions and will guess what their story is
- Students will predict what their peer's clay impression story is
- Students will imagine what the impressions their peers' made might mean

- How can we guess what happened somewhere by the impressions on the ground there?

AQ:

- Can anyone tell me where this carving is from?
- What was the purpose of hieroglyphics?
- What do you think these symbols are telling us?
- Does anyone read comics? How are hieroglyphics similar to comics?
- What is the comic telling us without words?

VQ:

- What qualities in an object will lead to a clear impression?
- Why does this impression of cloth look so different than this impression of a wrench?
- What would happen if I pushed this object deeper into the clay?
- What might it mean if you overlap two of the impressions?

TQ:

- What would happen if you pushed the object into the clay harder?
- What other impressions could you make with this object?
